TEN TIPS FOR BEING A LITTLE ECOLOGIST!

1.PLANT A TREE

It's good for the air!!! We made it meaningful for the whole family, and we will plant a tree every year each member!!!! AND YOU CAN DO IT!!!

2. WRAP CREATIVELY

We can reuse gift bags, bows and paper, but we can also make something unique by using old maps, cloth or even newspaper. We can save some trees. And you can do it!!

3. BAN BATHTIME!

We plan to have a no-bath week, and take showers instead. Baths require almost twice as much water. Not only will we reduce water consumption, but the energy costs associated with heating the water.

4. TAKE A SHORTER SHOWER

Every two minutes you save on your shower can conserve more than ten litres of water. If everyone in the country saved just one litre from their daily shower, over the course of the year it would equal twice the amount of freshwater withdrawn from a mountain river every day.

5. TURN OFF LIGHTS

We have European cooperation concerns and deal with Socrates- Comenius projects: in 2001-2003 - "Des sciences et des techniques comme moyen de communication", in 2003-2006 - "Des tables en tables", having school partners from France, England and Spain, and in 2008-2010 "Let's do something for our planet", with : Italia, Spain, Austria, Latvia, Sweden, Bulgaria, France . Kindergarten Janni Rodari is located in the town of Gotse Delchev nestled on the slopes of Pirin mountain.



Kindergarten "Janni Rodari" was established in 1972.

There are 6 groups of children at age from 1 to 7 years. There is also 1 toddlers group.

The total number of children is 154.

The kindergarten works under the international program "Step by Step" since 1999.

Rudbārži rural landscape in May

Oskara Kalpaka Rudbāržu primary school is situated in a small rural village Rudbārži (nearly 500 inhabitants) in the western part of Latvia. The name of village is first documented in the 16th century for a landlord estate. Nowadays it is the center of the Rudbārži parish (Latvian: Rudbāržu pagasts). Since 2009 the Rudbārži parish with the land area of 110 km² is one of the amalgamated units of the Skrunda local municipality (Latvian: Skrundas novads). Skrunda local municipality is estimated at 6 thousand people and a land area of 553 km².

In Rudbārži parish area small hills alternate with plains. The highest terrain point is located 129 m above sea level. Woods covers a half of parish area and therefore forestry and logging are developed. Major agricultural sectors are grain and pig farming. Some people manage a dairy and cattle-breeding, fish ponds; cultivate black currants, strawberries, shiitake mushrooms. On motorways accommodations and restaurants for travellers are opened, too.

The school is a public school. It runs 2 preschool groups (28 children) and 9 grades of the primary school (86 students). 19 full time and part time teachers work at school. In the afternoon the school offers the hobby groups of interest for pupils: sports, folk-dancing, choir-singing, vocal ensembles, environmental education, school newspaper and arts. The school has nice gym-hall and sports ground, modern computer room, premises for music, home economics, math and science, equipped with today's technologies.





The school has traditions tended to encourage the national and patriotic awareness of the students and local community. We take care for the Latvian traditional festivities. There are activities associated with the school name and commemoration of the national hero Colonel Oskars Kalpaks every year . We celebrate the country's birthday in November arranging a concert and lighting candles at windows of the school building. A musclemen's competition are held in November, too. The school has its newspaper, graduators' yearbook, calendar. Graduators traditionally held the Day of the Last Bell in May and the Day of Graduate in June. The gatherings of the graduators is organized every five years.

METHODOLOGY

"Göteborgs Högre Samskola", The Little School is a Montessori inspired school, where we assess each child according to his/her abilities. We aime to help the child to master abstract and creative thinking and to connect to his/her unlimited energy for research and exploration. Two fields which we focus on are Handicraft and the Arts, both enjoying high esteem in our school.

The children are encouraged to take responsibility for their own work. At the same time we acknowledge their need for freedom in making their own choices, as well as their need for individual strategies. We want our environment to inspire confidence and respectfulness so the children can meet their needs of curiosity, creativity and joy.



SCHOOL FACILITIES

Lilla Samskolan is spread out in seven different buildings creating an unusual layout. We have cosy classrooms with a homelike atmosphere well equipped with different teaching materials as well as computers and Internet. There are special classrooms for woodwork, handicraft, music, piano and violin lessons, gymnastics, drama, arts and crafts, domestic science and special needs teaching. We also have an infirmary with a school nurse and school restaurant with a cooking kitchen on site. The premises for afternoon care are planed to give the students the opportunity for free play, creativity and socializing.

Our school is situated in the middle of Gothenburg center with walking distance to museums parks and botanical gardens etc. All though we are so central we have a surprising school yard with a hills, grass, trees, wooden porches and paved areas offering natural and arranged environments to play. There is a school garden, football field, basketball court, swings, climbing wall, slides etc.
